The Defend Trade Secrets Act of 2016 (DTSA) (Pub.L. 114-153, 130 Stat. 376, enacted May 11, 2016, codified at 18 U.S.C. § 1836, et seq.) is a United States federal law that allows an owner of a trade secret to sue in federal court when its trade secrets have been misappropriated. The act was signed into law by President Barack Obama on May 11, 2016.

The Defend Trade Secrets Act (DTSA), signed into law on May 11, 2016, “federalizes” trade secret law by providing a procedure for trade secret owners to file civil lawsuits in federal court.
