The Enduring Importance of Richard Wright

The next subseries, "Books," is the largest, consisting of drafts of all of Wright's published works and manuscripts of several unpublished books. Bedridden in his Odéon apartment, Richard Wright—author of the 1940 novel *Native Son* and the autobiographical *Black Boy* (1945), his searing account of growing up in the Jim Crow South—spent the last year and a half of his life, before his death in 1960 at the age of fifty-two, writing haiku: “The sound of the rain / Blotted out now and then / By a sticky cough.”

WPA Federal Writers' Project, a program established in the United States in 1935 by the Works Progress Administration (WPA) as part of the New Deal struggle against the Great Depression. It provided jobs for unemployed writers, editors, and research workers. Directed by Henry G. Alsberg, it operated in all states and at one time employed 6,600 men and women.
